



Qualified NJ residents of any age may be eligible for free or low cost health insurance that covers doctor appointments, prescriptions, preventative screening, x-rays, hospitalizations, dental care, and mental health services.

Low Income Energy Assistance

New Jersey's program for families is known as Work First New Jersey/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (WFNJ/TANF). This program provides monthly cash, child care, job search and readiness, and short-term housing support for eligible New Jersey residents.

Earned Income Tax Credit is a federal and state tax credit benefit for individuals and families who earn low to moderate income in New Jersey.

Social Services for the Homeless

Any person having reasonable cause to believe that a child has been abused or neglected has a legal responsibility to report it to DCF's Child Protection and Permanency
